

said Leon Gale the s^d forty shillings sterling and forty shillings current money and all costs accruing by virtue of the writ of attachment aforesaid &c.

Whereupon a certain Thomas Hayward of Somerset County present herein Court in his proper person undertook for the said Leon Gale according to act of assembly in such case made and provided that in case the said Gerritt Ralshford shall at any time within a year and a day appear and make all or any part of the said Leon Gale's claim against him appear to be satisfied or otherwise to have been indue before the laying of this attachment that then the said Leon Gale shall make restitution unto him the said Gerritt Ralshford of all or such part thereof as shall be made appear to be indue &c. or that he the said Thomas Hayward will do the same for him &c.

Therefore it is considered by the Justices here that the s^d sums of forty shillings sterling and forty shillings current money and five hundred pounds of tobacco so as aforesaid be condemned in the hands of the s^d John Britt as of the right and credit of the s^d Gerritt Ralshford towards satisfying unto the s^d Leon Gale as well the s^d sums of forty shillings sterling and forty shillings current money as also all costs accruing by virtue of the writ of attachment aforesaid and that the said Leon Gale have thereof execution against the said John Britt according to act of assembly &c.

John Ellis - Command was given to the Sheriff of Somerset County that he should take of Thomas Bellings late of Somerset County Mariner if he should be found in his backquitch and him should safe keep so that he might have his body before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at dividing Creek the third Tuesday of March then next to answer unto John Ellis of plea that he render him thirty shillings current money of Maryland and three hundred & sixty two pounds of tobacco which to him he owes & unjustly detains and that thereof he should not fail &c. Whereupon the said John Ellis by George Douglas his attorney declares against the said Thomas Bellings in the plea aforesaid as followeth to wit: Thomas Bellings late of Somerset County Mariner was summoned to answer to John Ellis of plea that he render him thirty shillings current money of Maryland and three hundred and sixty two pounds of tobacco which to him he owes and unjustly detains - And whereupon the said John by George Douglas his attorney says that whereas the said John heretofore to wit on the eighteenth day of March Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and twenty eight in the Court of the Right Honourable Charles above said late Lord and Proprietary of the provinces of Maryland and Avalon &c. held at dividing Creek for the County of Somerset before Samuel Hopkins Gent. and his associates then Justices of the said Lord Proprietary for the said County to keep the peace assigned by
