Edward hath sustained damages by occasion of the premises beyond his costs and charges by him about his suit in that part appored to fifteen pounds three shillings and one penny current money of Maryland & not more and because the afo. Edward deny not this but the same allegation confesseth to be true prays Judgment for those damages above confessed together with his costs and charges aforesaid to him to be adjudged &c.

Therefore by consent of the parties afo. it is considered that the aforesaid Edward should recover against the afo. John Bishop Junr. his damages afo. to the afo. fifteen pounds three shillings and one penny current money of Maryland in form afo. confessed as also three hundred pounds of tobacco for his costs and charges to the same Edward by the Court here and consent of the parties afo. adjudged and the afo. defendt. in mercy &c.

It being made appear to me John Scott one of his Lordships Justices of the Peace for the County afo. the peace to him assigned that John Glas is actually run away and has or is about to remove his Effects out of the County to defraud his Creditors you are hereby required to issue an attachment on behalf of Seward Tomlinson for the sum as in the account here sent you proved with the Incident Costs and Charges according to the form of the act of assembly in such Case lately made and provided and for your so doing this shall be your sufficient Warrant as witness my hand this 4<sup>th</sup> day of March and Done 1734

To Thomas Hayward Esq. of Somerset County Pursuant to an act of assembly in this province now in force and in obedience to the above said warrant was issued the following attachment against the goods chattles rights or credits of the afo. John Glas the tenour of which will followeth in these words Viz. - Somerset sh Charles the absolute Lord and Proprietary of the provinces of Maryland and Avalon St. Baron of Baltimore &c. Do hereby Command you that you attach any the goods Chattles rights or credits of John Glas late of Somerset County planted if they shall be found in your bailiwick to the Value of two pounds Eight Shillings and ten pence and four hundred fifty pounds of Tobacco and when you have the same attached or any part thereof the same in your custody safe keep so yt. you have the same before our Justices of our County Court of Somerset to be held at dividing week the third Tuesday of March next then and there to be condemned according to act of assembly to & for the use of a certain Seward Tomlinson unless the said John Glas by himself or his attorney shall appear and answer unto the sd. Seward Tomlinson of ayles of tregafagon &c. according to law & that by good and lawfull men of your bailiwick you make known unto the
