Chief Justice of our said Court the twenty seventh day of November in the Twentieth year of our Dominion &c.

At which said third Tuesday of March to wit the Eighteenth day of the same month Ann: Dom: One thousand Seven hundred and thirty four being the day of the return of the said writ cometh the said Seward Tomlinson by Robert Jenchins Henry his attorney and the Sheriff of Somerset County to whom the foregoing writ was directed likewise cometh and maketh return thereof to the Court there Endorsed in these words following Vizt

To the Justices within mentioned I certify that I have attached the sums within mentioned on the first day of March in the Year of our Lord Seventeen hundred & thirty four at Somerset County in the hands of Samuel Turner Junr. and at the same time and place made known to the same Samuel Turner that he should be and appear at the day and place within mentioned to show cause why the same should not be condemned for the use within mentioned before Francis Porter and John Doe good and lawfull men of my bailiwick so answer
For: W. Foster Sheriff

And the said Samuel Turner Junr. altho. solemnly called cometh not nor shows cause why &c. Whereupon the said Seward Tomlinson by his attorney aforesaid present here in Court prays that upon giving security according to act of assembly in such case provided the said sum of two pounds Eight Shillings and ten pence and four hundred and fifty pounds of tobacco so as aforesaid attached may be condemned in the hands of the said Samuel Turner Junr. as of the rights and Credits of the said John Glas towards satisfying unto him the said Seward Tomlinson his damages and all costs and Charges by evasion of the attachment aforesaid.

Thereupon Robert Jenchins Henry of Somerset County Gents present herein Court under: took for the said Seward Tomlinson that in case the said John Glas do at any time within a Year and a day appear and make all or any part of the said Seward Tomlinson's claim against him appear to be satisfied or otherwise to have been undue before the laying of this attachment that then the said Seward Tomlinson shall make restitution unto him the said John Glas of all or such part as shall be made appear to be undue &c. or that he the said Robert Jenchins Henry will do the same for him.

Therefore it is considered by the Court here that the aforesaid two pounds Eight Shillings & ten pence and four hundred and fifty pounds of tobacco so as aforesaid attached be condemned in the hands of the aforesaid Samuel Turner Junr. as of the rights and Credits of the said John Glas towards satisfying unto the said Seward Tomlinson his damages and also all costs and Charges by evasion of the attachment aforesaid and that the said Seward have the use of his Tobacco according to act of assembly in such case provided &c.
