Justices at Dividing Crook aforesaid Remaining manifestly apparoth. —  
Nevertheless Execution of the Judgm<sup>t</sup>. afo<sup>r</sup>. as yett Remaineth to be made as by  
the Insinuation of the afores<sup>d</sup>. James we have reced and because we are  
Willing that those things which in our Court afores<sup>d</sup>. are Rightfully Acted ought  
to be duly Executed We Comand you that by Honest and Lawfull men of your  
Balywick you make known unto the afo<sup>r</sup>. Hober Whittingham that he be and  
Appear before Our Justices of our County Court of Somerset to be held at Dividing  
Crook the third tuesday of November next, to show cause if that any thing for  
himself he hath or to say knoweth wherefore the aforesaid James Donelson his  
Execution of the Judgm<sup>t</sup>. afo<sup>r</sup>. Against the afores<sup>d</sup>. Hober ought to have According  
to the form of the Recovery afo<sup>r</sup>. if to him it shall seem Expedient and have you  
there the Names of them before whom you make the same known and this  
Writt Witness Rob<sup>t</sup> King Cont. Chief Justice of our same Court the nineteenth  
Day of August in the Eighteenth Year of our said W. Anno Dom<sup>o</sup> on the thaus<sup>d</sup>.  
Seven hundred and thirty two.

At which said third Tuesday of Nov<sup>r</sup>.  
to wit the twenty first Day of the same Month Anno Dom<sup>o</sup> one  
thousand seven hundred and thirty two cometh the aforesaid James Donelson  
by his Attorney afores<sup>d</sup>. and the Sher<sup>iff</sup> of Somerset County to wit Joshua  
Cattwell Cont at the same Day Returned that he by Virtue of the writt  
afo<sup>r</sup>. to him thereof Directed had made known unto the aforesaid Hober  
Whittingham by Joshua Merrill and John Dod honest and Lawfull men  
of his Balywick that he be and appear before the Justices of his Lordships  
County Court of Somerset had at the day and place aforesaid to show & c. as  
to him it was Comanded. & whereupon the said James Donelson prays  
Execution ag<sup>t</sup>. the afo<sup>r</sup>. Hober Whittingham for his Damages afo<sup>r</sup>. and his  
Costs and Charges to him to be Adjudged & c. And the aforesaid Hober  
Whittingham by William Bockingham his Attorney Comes and prays  
Leave thereof to Impare here untill next Court and he hath it and the  
same Day is Given to the afores<sup>d</sup>. James here also & c.

At which said Next Court  
to wit the Twentieth Day of March Anno Dom<sup>o</sup> one thousand seven  
hundred and thirty two came again as well the aforesaid James Donelson as  
the aforesaid Hober Whittingham by their Attorneys afo<sup>r</sup>. and thereupon  
the said Hober prays further Leave thereof to Impare here untill the  
Next Court and he hath it and the same Day is Given to the said James  
here also & c. — At which said next Court to wit the Nineteenth  
Day of June Anno Dom<sup>o</sup> one thousand seven hundred and thirty three.
