Before us the Subscribers Comiss^{ns}: Appointed to Examine Evidences in Relation to y^e Bounders of the above said Tract of Land and Deposeth on the Holy Evangelist of Almighty God (viz^t) The Deponent saith that about thirty years past that he was Told by his father Giddion Tilghman D^d. that on a certain Point of Land lying on the Beaver Dam which Point of Land is a Point of Land on the Westermost End of the now Dwelling Plantation of Stephen Dear son: Where there now is a marked Red Oak y^e within six foot of the said Markt oak there stood a Tree which was the corner tree of the above Tract of Land called Amity which did belong to Alexander Draper late of this County D^d as also it was a corner Tree of a certain Tract of Land called Double Purchase which did belong to Randall Rowell late of this County D^d and that it was the Dividing Tree betwixt the above said Tracts of Land and further this Deponent saith not only that the above corner Tree was a Red Oak
