George Collins aged about Twenty Six Years being sworn on the Holy Evangelist of Almighty God before us above named concerning his knowledge of the Boundaries of Hogg Quarter and Common Garden deposeth as followeth that about this time twelve Months this Deponent and John Richardson and John Notham who is now Dead went down to the Marshes called Sandy Hill Marshes and that the said John Notham shew'd him the said Collins a small Brook that issues out of Colliers Brook and that the said Notham told this Deponent that when the said Notham was a boy he the said Notham and his father used to go down to that Brook a fishing and that the Brook used to be call'd fishing Brook and further saith not

Charles Thompson aged about fifty three Years who

Being Sworn on the Holy Evangelist of Almighty God touching his Knowledge of the boundaries of a Tract of Land called Hogg Quarter and another Tract called Common Garden before us James Daffield Robt. Collier and William Dashell Deposeth as followeth that when this Deponent was about twelve or fourteen years old this Deponent and W<sup>m</sup> Chisman and a certain John Russell used to go a fishing in a small Brook issuing out of a small Brook known by the Name of Colliers Brook and that this Deponent heard the said Chisman and the said Russell say that old William Green tell them that that Brook that issued out of Colliers Brook was call'd fishing Brook and that further this Deponent saith about six years past he heard old Roger Nicholson say that the Brook issuing out of Colliers Brook used to be call'd fishing Brook formerly and that this Deponent about last Christmas heard a certain W<sup>m</sup> Layton of Dorset County say that formerly he used to fish in a Brook that Colliers Brook and that made one Mouth and that Colliers Brook made down the River into the Woods and the other made upwards into the Marshes and the said Layton told this Deponent that the Brook that made into the Marshes used to be call'd fishing Brook and further the Deponent Charles Thompson declareth that the W<sup>m</sup> Chisman and John Russell were old Married Men at the time the said Thompson and Chisman and Russell used to fish in the said fishing Brook and that the said Russell then lived about two Miles from ye said Brook on Dorset Side and the said Chisman abut-
