Somerset Co. By Somerset County Court Octob^r. 8: 1731

Ordered that Mess^r Robert King, David Wilson and Thomas Williams or any two
of them view and Road that Major William Blaner hath cleared and ditched; and see if it be good and payable
and they or any two of them to make their Report to the said County Court of Somerset. -

On the back side of the foregoing Order it was then endorsed; this is to Certifie that we the Subscribers
have viewed the within Road and think it is as good and payable as the Old Road as without our
hands. - June 8: 1733 - - - - - David Wilson - Thomas Williams - - -

Upon the Motion of James Darrell to the Justices of Somerset County at a Court held in November and 1731
for the removing of a road which went near his plantation it was ordered that the said Road be removed -
according to the direction of the subscriber whereupon I caused the said Road to be cleared from the
head of Tipquini to a branch called the deep branch and that it is nearer than the former Road - -

bound from Richard Tull - William Wharton all of Somerset County in the province of planters are helden and firmly bound
unto Richard Tull Stephen Tull and either Tull Orphans of John Tull decd. in the sume and just
Sume of One hundred and five pounds hou shillings Current money to be paid unto the said Richard Stephen and
either Tull their heirs Executors Administrators or assigners to the which payment well and truly to be made and
done we bind our selves and either of us in joint tenors and attds: for the whole and in the whole jointly and severally
firmly by these presents sealed with our Seal and dated the 20. day of June a.m.d. dñe: 1733.

The condition of the above Obligation is such that wheras the sume of money herein transmitted unto
this Court the amount of the estate of John Tull decd. whereso it is found that there is balance due to the above
said Orphans the sume of fifty two pounds Eleven shillings Current money - If therefore the abovesaid John
Tull his heirs Executors or Administrators shall and do well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto the
above named Richard Tull Stephen Tull and either Tull the sume of fifty two pounds Eleven shillings
to be paid them according to the decd. will and the act of assembly in such case made and provided when they
shall arrive at full age to receive the same then the above Obligation to be void and of no effect otherwise
to stand and remain in full force and Virtue in Law - John Tull -
