Somerset Sh. By Somerset County Court Octob^r. 8: 1731
Ordered that Mess^{rs}. Robert King, David Wilson and Thomas Williams or any two
of them view a new Road that Major William Blanner hath cleared and ditched; and see if it be good and pass-
able and they or any two of them to make their Report to the said County Court of Somerset. —
On the back side of the foregoing Order it was thus endorsed: This is to certify that we the Subscribers
have viewed the within Road and think it is as good and passable as the Old Road as witness our
hands - June 2: 1733 ----- David Wilson - Thomas Williams - - -

Upon the motion of James Darke to the Justices of Somerset County at a Court hold in November and 1731
for the moving of a Road which went near his plantation it was ordered that the said Road be moved —
according to the direction of me the subscriber whereupon I caused the said Road to be cleared from the
head of Tipquin to a branch called the deep branch and that it is nearer than the former Road —
June Court and a new 1733. Certified to the worshipful Court by me -- J. M. Baker. —

Know all men by these presents that we John Tull George Bawton &
William Wharton all of Somerset County in the province of planters are laden and fully bound
unto Richard Tull Stephen Tull and Esther Tull Orphanes of John Tull dec. in the full and Just
Sum of One hundred and five pounds two shillings Current money to be paid unto the said Richard Stephen and
Esther Tull their heirs Executors Administrators or assignes to the which payment well and truly to be made and
done we bind our selves and either of our heirs Executors and assigns for the whole and in the whole jointly and severally
firmly by these presents sealed with our Seal and dated the 20th day of June and. and. 1733. —

The condition of the above obligation is such that whereas the Comiffary gent^s hath transmitted unto
this Court the account of the estate of John Tull dec. wherein it is found that there is ballance due to the above
said Orphanes the sum of fifty two pounds Eleven shillings Current money -- If therefore the abovesaid John
Tull his heirs Executors or Administrators shall and do well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto the
above named Richard Tull Stephen Tull and Esther Tull the said sum of fifty two pounds Eleven shillings
to be paid them according to the said will and the act of a Assembly in such case made and provided when they
shall arrive at full age to Receive the same then the above obligation to be void and of none Effect otherwise
to stand and Remain in full force and Virtue in Law &c —
