The Deposition of Rob^t Given son aged about fifty
Nine years being sworn on the Holy Evangelist of Almighty God Doth sayth and
sayth that about Twenty years ago he was in Company with James Given and
James Caldwell son up Broad Branch and they shod him a Marked White Oak
About a quarter of a Mile above y^e old Road that Leads from James Given's to James
Caldwells being on the East Side of said Branch as he Remembers which this Depoant
always understood that the said White Oak where he now stands with hand on the same
was the first Bounder of W^m Maulives Land partly then in the possession of said Caldwell
and this Depoant further sayth in Relation to Another bounder on the South Side of the
Main Branch of Rowastice that about thirty years ago Tho^s Ackworth Deceased told
this Depoant that this White Oak whereon he now hath his hand was a bounder of his Land
and that it Divided his Land from W^m Maulives Land & was also Maulives Bounder —
and this Depoant further sayth that James Caldwell said several years before he
Died Brought this Depoant to the White Oak & he this Depoant Remem^{ber} over all
of the Lines of the within Moutioned Land he^r Caldwell having the Possession & made

the Holy Evangelist of Almighty God Doth sayth and sayth that about nine years
ago Rich^d Ackworth son now Deceased showed this Depoant this Marked white oak
that he hath his hand now upon and told him that it was the second bounder of his —
Land called Weatherlys Contrivance of three hundred Acres part whereof the said
Ackworth sold to this Depoant and Likewise show'd this Depoant a Marked white
Oak about Twenty four yards to the South East of said Bounder which he said was
Jⁿ Lamais Bounder and this Depoant further sayth that the said Ackworth came
from said Bounder with him down Broad Branch to the Main Branch where
stood a Marked white oak & old Slip white Oak where this Depoant now
stands with his hand on the said White Oak and being on Horseback pointed
to the said White Oaks & told him if white Oak was his bounder but which of the
Two this Depoant cannot tell if said Oaks being Nigh together and further
