Somerset P. William Wye Junr. Late of Somerset County  
marriner was summoned to answer unto Tunstall Hack  
of age 21 that he render unto him one Negro man named

Scipio of the price of forty pounds current money of Maryland one  
Negro woman named Moll of the price of thirty five pounds Like money and one girl  
named Rose of the price of thirty five pounds current money of Maryland which from  
him he unlawfully detains &c.

And where upon the same Tunstall Hack by John Caldwell his next friend who is admitted  
by the Court here to prosecute for him he being an Infant under the age of Twenty one year,  
saith that whereas he the said Tunstall the tenth day of October one thousand Seven  
hundred and thirty one at Somerset County within the Jurisdiction of this Court was possessed  
of one Negro man named Scipio of the price of forty pounds current money of Maryland  
one Negro woman named Moll of the price of thirty five pounds Like money and one  
girl called Rose of the price of thirty five pounds current money of Maryland as his  
proper slaves and so those being possessed the said Tunstall afterwards to with the same day  
and year ago the said three slaves out of his hands and possession casually lost which  
said three slaves afterwards to with the same day and year ago at the County ago within the  
Jurisdiction ago to the hands and possession of the said William by finding same and in his  
hands and possession yet are, by which action hath accrued to the same Tunstall to have  
Require of the said William the same slaves ago yett the said William has. often thereto  
required hath not delivered the said slaves or any of them but the said William the said  
slaves hitherto to deliver hath denied and still doth deny whereby the same Tunstall says  
he is worse and hath damage to the value of one hundred pounds current money and knoweth  
he brings this suit &c. Jo. Caldwell ff. A.

And the said William Wye by William Bevingham his attorney comes and defends the force  
and injury when &c. and prays leave thereto to impare hereuntole next Court and he  
hath it and the same day is given the said John Caldwell next friend of the said Tunstall here  
also &c. Att
