that the said Sarah Staples do not make her personale appearance before the Justice of his Lord-
ship's County Court of Somerset to be held at Widning Creek the third Tuesday of November next, and
do not answer unto his Lordship of and concerning the presentment aforesaid, and do not stand and abide
the Judgment of the Court thereupon, and do depart the same Court without Leave hereof.

of every of them to the use of the said Lord Proprietary his heirs and Successors to be made and Levied.

If it happen that the said Andrew Thompson do not make his personale appearance before the Justice of his Lord-
ship's County Court of Somerset to be held at Widning Creek the third Tuesday of November next and do not an-
swer unto his said Lordship of such matters as shall be objectred against him and do depart the same Court
without Leave hereof and in the mean time if he is not of the good behaviour toward his said Lordship
and all his good people &c
