his goods and Chattels Land, and tenements to the use of his said Lordship his heirs and Successors
to be made and Levied If it Happen that said William Dolbin do not make his personall
appearance before the Justices of his Lordship's County Court of Somerset to be held at Dividing
Creek the third Tuesday of November next and do not then and there give such evidence as he shall
know against Richard Swift on Suspicion of felony, and do depart the same Court without Leave
thereof he stands.

William Holland } and Dow. One thousand Seven hundred and thirty three came hereinto Court before the
Worshipfull Robert King Esq. and his associates Justices of the same Court Robert Jenckins
Henry Gents. who for the Right honorable the Lord Proprietary in this part prosecutes and gives the
said Court to understand and be informed that William Holland late of Somerset County plunder
the Seventeenth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand Seven hundred and thirty three
at the County and within the Jurisdiction of this Court with force and arms in and upon a certain John
Britt in the peace of God and the said Lord Proprietary then and there being an assault did make
and him did beat sound and Evilly Inhabited so that of his Life it was greatly distressed and
Other harmes to him the said Britt then and there did do to his great damage and against the peace
of the Right honorable the Lord Proprietary his good Rule and Government whereof the said Rob.
Jenckins Henry prays advice of the Court and that due proof of Law against the said Wm.
Holland may be done. Thereupon Command was given to the Just: of Somerset that he should
take the said William Holland if he to answer and afterwards herein the same Court before his Lord
ship's Justices at Dividing Creek came the said William Holland and hath avowing of the Information
and thereupon the said William Holland Submits with a protestation of his Innocency and puts
himself upon the favour of the Court. whereupon also Singular the premises by the Court here
been heard and fully understood. Wherefore it is considered by the Court that the said
William Holland pay unto his said Lordship the Lord Proprietary for his fine here upon him
