Somerset County vs Susannah Wordie late of Somerset County Widow
was Attached to Answer unto John Caldwell of a Plea of Trespass

Q. D. Susannah Wordie Upon the Case re.

And Whereupon the said John by Francis Allen his Attorney complains that
Whereas the said Susannah after the first Day of May Anno Dom. one thousand seven
hundred and five to witt the eighteenth day of June Anno Dom. Seventeen hundred
thirty one at the County of Somerset aforesaid within the Jurisdiction of this Court made her
Certain note in writing (called a promissary note with her proper hand subscribed bearing
date the day and Year last mentioned and the said Note to the said John then and
there delivered by which said note the said Susannah did oblige herself her heirs
Exors or Assignes to pay unto the said John his heirs or Assignes the sum of Nineteen
pounds Curr. money of Maryland or three thousand eight hundred pounds of Tob.
Betwixt the date thereof & April then next and by Reason thereof as also by
force of the Statute in that Case lately made and provided the said Susannah
became chargeable to pay to the said John the said sum of Nineteen pounds Curr
money of Maryland or three thousand eight hundred pounds of Tob. And so
being chargeable the said Susannah in consideration thereof afterwards
to witt the afo. eighteenth day of June Seventeen hundred and eleven above
said at the County aforesaid within the Jurisdiction afo. upon herself did assume
and to the said John then and there did faithfully promise to pay the said
Nineteen pounds Currant money aforesaid or three thousand eight hundred pounds
of Tob. according to the Tenor of the said Note Nevertheless the said Susannah
her promise and Assumption aforesaid in form afo. made nothing regarding but
plotting and fraudulently Intending the said John in that part craftily and slyly
to deceive and Defraud the Oath by the said John thereunto Requested the said
Nineteen pounds Currant money or three thousand eight hundred pounds of Tob.
According to the Tenor of the said note to the said John as yett hath not paid
or Contented but the same to him hitherto to pay or Content hath refused
and still doth refuse and deny Whereupon he saith he is worse and
hath Damage to the value of thirty eight pounds money aforesaid or
seven thousand six hundred pounds of Tob. And thereupon he brings
Suit es of 2^d Pledge of 2^d Pledge. In the
