

August Court 1733 — 75 —

Justices of our said Court at Dividing Creek in the County aforesaid by Consideration of the same Court recovered against William Hearn late of Somerset County Planter and Decd. William Hearn of Somerset County in the Province of Maryland Planter as well a certain Debt of Two thousand eight hundred seventy and two pence of Merchantable Tobacco and Fees as three hundred and twenty one pounds of Tob^o which to the said Thomas in our said Court were Adjudged for his Damages which he had by Occasion of the Detaining of the said Debt whereas his Counsel as by the Record and proceeding thereof in our said Court before our Justices at Dividing Creek Remaining manifestly Appereth that the Execution of the Judgment afd. as yet Remaineth to be made and the afd. The said Layfield is since Decd. as by the Intimation of Cathrine Layfield and George Layfield Executors of the Testament and Last will of the afd. Thomas we have read and because we will that those things which in our said Court are Rightfully Acted Ought to be duly Executed We Command you that by honest and Lawfull men of your Bailiwick you make known unto the said William Hearn that he be and Apper before our Justices of our County Court of Somerset to be held at Dividing Creek the third Tuesday of August next to show Cause if any thing for himself he hath or to say knoweth wherefore the aforesaid Cathrine and George should not have their Execution against him of the Debt and Damages afd. According to the form of the Recovery afd. if unto him it shall seem Expedient and have you then and therewith Witness Robt. King Gent. the 25: day of June in the 1st. Year of our Dominion Be Anno Dom 1733

At which said third Tuesday of August to wit the twenty first Day of the said Month Anno Dom one thousand seven hundred and thirty three before the Justices of his Lordship's County Court of Somerset held at Dividing Creek in the County afd. (and the afd. Cathrine Layfield and George Layfield Ex^{rs} as aforesaid by Francis Allen their Attorney aforesaid and the Sher^{iff} of Somerset County to wit Joshua Adwell Gent. at the said day Returned that he by Virtue of the within writ afd. to him Directed had made known unto the afd. William Hearn by John Dod & Rich^d Roe honest and Lawfull men of his Bailiwick that he be and Apper before his said Lordship's Justices at the day and place afd. to shew Cause as within which it was so commanded and the said W^m Hearn so forwarned and at the said day being solemnly Called Cometh not but makes Default Therefore it is Considered that the afd. Cathrine Layfield & George Layfield have Execution against the same W^m Hearn of the Debt and Damages afd. According to the force form and Effect of the Recovery afd. W.
