Mitchel Dashiell of Somerset County Gent. present herein Court  
in his proper person, is appointed by the same Court as Guardian  
unto George Nicholson, William Nicholson, and Margaret Nicholson orphans  
of John Nicholson late of Somerset County decd. which said Orphans are under the age  
of fourteen years &c. and it is ordered by the Court here that the said Mitchell Dashiell take into  
his Care and possession all the Estate of the aforesaid Orphans both Reall and personall and Likewise  
that he give Security for to comply with the Guardianship aforesaid

Whereupon the said Mitchell Dashiell with Maj George Dashiell his Security both  
present herein Court in their proper persons acknowledged themselves to be indebted unto the  
the aforesaid George Nicholson, William Nicholson and Margaret Nicholson orphans aforesaid and each of them in  
the sum of fifty pounds Sterling of their goods and Chattell Lands and tenements Joyntly and  
severally to the use of the said George, William and Mary<sup>e</sup> Nicholson their heirs and assigns  
if it happen that the aforesaid Mitchell Dashiell do not comply with the Law in relation to  
the Guardianship aforesaid and do not deliver up unto the aforesaid George, William and Margaret Nicholson  
their heirs or assigns or Guardian or Guardians all their Reall and personall that he shall  
have in his hands and possession peaceably and quietly when ever the same shall be Legally required
