The petition afo being read and heard and fully understood therefore it is considered that the afo Sarah Gray be discharged for the future from paying of taxes for the aforesaid Negro Convey as by the petition afo is proved &c.

Whereas a certain Honour Haley being convicted in this Court for bearing an Oath to barlard Child and according to an act of assembly in this province now in force there is due from the said Honour Haley to the Inhabitants of Somerset County for such Inordinate Expulacion Seven Years Service and forasmuch as it did appear to the Court here that the said Honour was so indisposed, and distempered with that distemper called the pox and a pain in her Limbs that she must inevitably perish without a Speedy remedy &c.

Whereupon the said Honour Haley is sold by the Court here according to Law to Capt John Scott for Seven Years, the said Seven Years Service to Commence from the first day of October Last the said Honour to serve the said John Scott his heir or assigns the full term of nine years &c. In consideration of which Service the said John Scott is to Endeavour the making a perfect Cure of the said Honour Haley of the distemper and Likewise pay to the Use of the County aforesaid ten pounds of Tobacco &c.

The petition aforesaid being read and heard and fully understood and mature Deliberation thereupon had. Wherefore it is considered that the afo John Dennis turn the Road afo to a Landing lying on the upper side of the plantation afo according to the direction of John Webb the overseer of the same Road, and if it shall appear hereafter that the old Road running thro' the plantation afo was settled by any former Order of Court, that than the same now Road so to be turned as afo be by the said John Dennis made as good and passable as the afo old Road &c.
