Therefore by Consent of the parties it is Considered that the afo<sup>d</sup> Damages recover against the afo<sup>d</sup> Philip Taylor his Manager and to the afo<sup>d</sup> Nine hundred and Sixty three pounds of tobacco by the same Philip in form afo<sup>d</sup> Confessed as also two hundred and ninety pounds of tobacco for his Costs and Charges and to the same Damages at his Request by the Court here and Consent of the parties afo<sup>d</sup> adjudged and the afo<sup>d</sup> defendant in mercy etc -- and afterwards Immediately the said Philip Taylor present here in Court in his proper person and upon the same Philip Taylor at the prayer of the afo<sup>d</sup> James by his attorney afo<sup>d</sup> is committed into the custody of the Jno<sup>d</sup> of Somers County there to remaine until the said James of the damage afo<sup>d</sup> should be fully satisfied etc.

And John Kendale Somerset vs Patrick Connally late of Somerset County Bell-makar was attached to answer to John Kendall of aplea of trespass upon the case & w<sup>r</sup>g. Patrick Connally And Whereupon the same John by George Douglas his attorney complains that whereas the said Patrick on the first day of May anno Dom<sup>m</sup> Seventeen hundred and thirty three at Somerset County aforesaid within the Jurisdiction of this Court was Indebted to the said John in the sum of four pounds four shillings and four pence halfpenny current money of Virginia of the Value of four pounds twelve shillings and nine pence Current money of this province for thirty two gallons and three Quarts of Rum and one barrel by the said John to the said Patrick before that time sold and delivered and the said Patrick being so thereof indebted on consideration thereof upon himself did assume and to the same John then and therewithal faithfully promise that he the said Patrick the aforesaid sum of four pounds four shillings and four pence halfpenny current money of Virginia of the Value aforesaid when he should be afterwards thereto required would well and faithfully Content and pay Never the less the afo<sup>d</sup> Patrick his promise and assumption aforesaid in manner and form aforesaid made little regarding but minding and fraudulently intending the aforesaid John in that part craftily and Subtilly to deceive and defraud the aforesaid sum of four pounds four shillings and four pence halfpenny current money of Virginia of the Value aforesaid or any part thereof to the said John the same to do afterwards v<sup>t</sup> the day and year last mentioned at Somerset County aforesaid within the aforesaid Jurisdiction the same Patrick by the said John was required hath not paid or any way Contented but the same to him to pay hitherto hath altogether refused and still doth refuse to the damage of the same John ten pounds current money and thereof he brings suit etc

And the afo<sup>d</sup> Patrick Connally by William Goldsborough his attorney comes and defends the same and saith that he cannot gainsay the action afo<sup>d</sup> of the afo<sup>d</sup> John Kendale nor can he say but that the said Patrick did assume upon himself in manner and form as afo<sup>d</sup> John above against him hath complained and as to the damages of the same John by him by occasion of the premises in that part sustained the said Patrick saith and confesseth that the afo<sup>d</sup> John has sustained damages by reason of the premises sufficient than his Costs and Charges by him about his Suit in that part apposed to four pounds twelve shillings and nine pence Current money of Maryland and not more and because the afo<sup>d</sup> John Denys not this but the same allegation confesseth to be true pray Judgment and those damages above confessed together with his Costs and Charges aforesaid to him adjudged etc Therefore it is Considered by Consent of the parties afo<sup>d</sup> that the afo<sup>d</sup> John Kendale recover against the afo<sup>d</sup> Patrick Connally his damage afo<sup>d</sup> to the afo<sup>d</sup> four pounds twelve shillings
