Attach any of the Goods Chattles Rights or Credits of Charles Reading Late of Somerset County
Planter if they shall be found in your Bailiwick to the Value Twelve hundred pounds of
tobacco and twenty Shillings and when you have the same attached or any part thereof
the same in your Custody safe keep so that you have the same before our Justices of our
County Court of Somerset to be held at dividing Creek the Third Tuesday of November next
then and there to be condemned according to Act of Assembly to and for the Use of a certain
Woney Macclamey Unless the said Charles Reading by himself or his attorney shall appear and
Answer unto the said Woney Macclamey in a plea of trespass upon the Case according to
Law and that by Good and Lawfull men of your Bailiwick you make known unto the
person
