person or persons in whose hands you make the same attachment that he she or they be and appear before our Justices of our County Court to be held as aforesaid to shew cause if any he she or they have why the same goods chattels rights or credits so attached in his her or their hands ought not to be condemned and execution thereof had made (according to act of Assembly in such case made and provided) if to him her or them it shall seem meet and how you shall execute this writt that you make known unto our said Justices at the day and place aforesaid and have you then and there this writt witness Robert King Gent Chief Justice of our said Court the Twenty fourth Day of August In the Nineteenth Year of Our Dominion & Anno Domini One Thousand Seven Hundred and Thirty Three

At which said third Tuesday of November to wit the twentieth day of the same month and year One thousand Seven hundred and thirty three came the said Woney M'Gennney by Francis Allen his attorney and the rest of Somerset County to whom the foregoing writt was directed Likewise Sarah and Elizabeth Petrea thereof to the Court here endorsed in these words following vid. — By virtue of the within writt to me directed to the Justices of Somerset County Court I do certify that on the fifteenth day of November One thousand Seven hundred and thirty three I did attach of the goods and chattels of a certain Charles Redding to the value of twelve hundred pounds of tobacco and twenty shillings for the due of Woney M'Gennney in the hands of Robert Geddes and I further certify that by John Dennis and Joshua Merrile good and lawfull men of my Parish which I have made known to the said Robert Geddes that he be and appear at the time and place appointed so answers — I do solemnly swear

Whereupon the said Robert Geddes garnishee of the aforesaid Charles Redding appears in his proper person and says that he cannot garnisay but that he has of the lights and credits of the said Charles Redding to the value of One thousand pounds of tobacco nor but that the same ought to be condemned in his hands for the due of the said Woney M'Gennney as of the lights and credits of the said Charles Redding which the party doth not garnisay.

Whereupon the aforesaid Woney M'Gennney by his attorney aforesaid prays that upon giving security according to act of assembly the sum of One thousand pounds of tobacco so as aforesaid confessed by the aforesaid Robert Geddes garnishee as aforesaid as of the lights and credits of the aforesaid Charles Redding may be condemned in the hands of the said Robert Geddes towards satisfying to the said Woney M'Gennney his damages and costs by means of the suit aforesaid.

Thereupon a certain William M'Gennney of Somerset County planter present hands in Court undertaken for the said Woney M'Gennney that if in case the said Charles Redding do at any time within a year and a day appear and make all or any part of the said Woney M'Gennneys claim against him to be satisfied or otherwise to be undue before the laying of the attachment aforesaid that then the said Woney M'Gennney shall make restitution unto the said Charles Redding of all or such part thereof as shall be so made appear to be undue as aforesaid or that he the said William M'Gennney will do the same for him.

Therefore it is considered that the said sum of One thousand pounds of tobacco so as aforesaid confessed be condemned in the hands of the said Robert Geddes as of the lights and credits of the said Charles Redding towards satisfying unto the said Woney M'Gennney as well his damages by reason of the premises aforesaid as also all costs and charges arrearing by reason of the attachment aforesaid and that the aforesaid Woney M'Gennney have these of his memoranda. The said Robert Geddes voluntarily takes his oath that he hath no more of the effects of the deftor than that he has confessed as aforesaid
