And whereupon the said Johnson by Francis Allen his attorney Complains that the said Johnson called Sandy Hill at Somerset County aforesaid within the Jurisdiction of this Court he did break and enter and Sixty Oak Trees thereon growing of the Value of three shillings current money of Maryland Each Tree he did cut down and consume and other harms to the said Johnson then and there did to the great damage of the said Johnson that now is his good rule and government & and to the damage of the said Johnson of nine pounds current money aforesaid and thereof he brings Suite &c

And the aforesaid Philip Selby by William Beckingham his attorney Comes and defends the force and Injury when &c and prays leave there of to Impare here until next Court and he hath it and the same day is given to the aforesaid Johnson here also &c
