At which said next court to witt the Twentieth day of November ann<sup>d</sup> Dom<sup>d</sup> One thousand seven hundred and thirty three came again as well the afo Johnson Hill as the afo Philip Selby by their attorneys afo and whereupon the same Philip as before defends the force and Injury wherein he and saith that he is in no sort guilty of the premises above alledged against him of so putting himself upon the Country and the p<sup>t</sup> in like manner

Whereupon it is commanded the Sheriff of Somerset County that immediately he shoulde cause to come here before the Justices of the Lordships County Court of Somerset now sitting at Bridgwater for the County and twelve dayes by whom he and who neither he to knowe him because as well he and afterwards immediately came there of the Jury &c and the Jurors of that same Jury by Joshua Colwell Gentleman of the County afo to this Impariment being called came to witt William Hardy, John Dennis and Joshua Atkinson Robert Murchison, John Webb Lazarus Maddox John Brittingham, John Lane Francis Henderson, Francis Porter Abraham Smith and Giddon Tilman who to say the truth of the premises afo being Ockted tried and sworn upon their oaths did say that the afo Philip Selby is guilty of the hys afo in manner and form as the afo Johnson did above against him hath complained and did assess the damage of the same Johnson by reason of the premises afo beyond his costs & charges by him about his Suit in that part appertaining to three pounds ten shillings Current money and for those costs and charges to one pound of tobacco —

Therefore it is considered that the afo Johnson did recover against the afo Philip Selby his damages afo to the afo three pounds ten shillings Current money and one pound of tobacco by the afo in sum afo assessed as also severall hundred fifty two pounds of tobacco to the same Johnson at his request for his costs and charges afo by his Justices of Increase adjudged and that the afo Philip be taken
