YOU Edward Cliffe John Perkins and Bruffe Broughton do Confess Judgment to Samuel Reah for the sum of Seventy pounds lawfull money of Maryland and four hundred twenty one pounds of tobacco which sum was recovered by the said Samuel Reah against Edward Cliffe on the nineteenth day of June one thousand seven hundred and thirty three in the county court the said seventy pounds lawfull money of Maryland and four hundred and Twenty one pounds of tobacco to be levied of your bodies goods and chattell In case the said Edward Cliffe shall not pay and satisfie to the said Samuel Reah the said seventy pounds lawfull money of Maryland and four hundred and twenty one pounds of tobacco so as aforesaid recovered against him with the additional costs thereon on the tenth day of Feby next Taken before us this twenty ninth of November one thousand seven hundred and thirty three
