

On motion of Mr. McKaig,

Leave was granted Messrs. McKaig, Goldsborough, of Talbot, and Dashiell, to report a bill entitled, An act to amend the act of 1826, ch. 123, entitled, An act to incorporate the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road Company.

Mr. Kimmel, from the Joint Committee appointed to wait upon His Excellency, the Governor, and inform him that the two Houses of the General Assembly were organized, and ready to receive any communication he might be pleased to make, reported that the committee had performed that duty; and that they had been requested by His Excellency to inform the Senate that he would, at 1½ o'clock, communicate a message to the two Houses.

Mr. Goldsborough, of Talbot, offered the following order:

Ordered, That when the Senate adjourns, it adjourns to meet on Monday next, at 12 o'clock.

A message was received from His Excellency, Governor Hicks, by the hands of James R. Partridge, Esq., Secretary of State.

Which was read.

Mr. Goldsborough, of Talbot, submitted the following order:

Ordered, That two thousand copies of the Governor's Message be procured, for the use of the Senate.

Mr. Dashiell moved to strike out "two thousand" and insert "three thousand;"

Which was adopted.

The question then recurred upon the adoption of the order, and was determined in the affirmative.

The President laid before the Senate various documents received from the Executive;

Which were ordered to lie on the table for future consideration.
