And be it enacted, That this act shall not be operative, or have any effect or validity, until and unless the act entitled, An act to amend the 4th Article of the Code of Public Local Laws, by amending the 33d section of said Article, relating to the police and general powers of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, and repealing the 774th, 775th, 776th, and 777th sections of said Article, relating to the Police of said city; and the power of the Mayor and City Council to establish and regulate the same, and inserting in said Article, in lieu of the sections so repealed, the following sections: ——; for the purpose of providing a permanent Police for the city of Baltimore, shall be passed and enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland.
