notified the absent Senators that their attendance was required.

Mr. Watkins withdrew his motion to reconsider.

Mr. Townsend obtained permission of the Senate to change his vote on the motion of Mr. Kimmel.

Mr. Yellott offered the following amendment:

And every policeman appointed under this act shall be a native born citizen of the United States, and a resident of the city of Baltimore for at least two years previous to his appointment;
