make an examination of the affairs and condition of the Maryland Penitentiary, and that they have full power to send tor persons and papers, and examine witnesses under oath, if necessary, and report to this General Assembly.

We concur therein, and have appointed, on the part of the Senate, Messrs. Heckart, Grahame and Lynch,
