Mr. Duvall presented the report of the Brookville Academy in Montgomery county;

Which was referred to the Committee on Education.

Mr. Lynch presented the memorial of citizens of Baltimore, against the charter of the Baltimore City Passenger Railway, under the control of Jonathan Brock and others;

Which was referred to the Committee on Joint Stock Companies.

Mr. Lynch presented the memorial of John Peddicord and Edward Wheat, for indemnification for losses that may arise from interference of railways, on or near the Frederick Turnpike road, with the omnibus passenger lines of the memorialists;

Which was read, and referred to the Committee on Finance.

Mr. Stone submitted the following message:

Resolved, By the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Adjutant General be and he is hereby ordered to furnish Captain Eben F. Perkins, of the Reed Rifle Company of Kent county, fifty rifles with sabre bayonets, from the quota due the State from the General Government for the year 1860, upon his giving security for the safe keeping and return of said arms, when required by the State.

Which was read, and referred to the Committee on Militia.

On motion of Mr. Nuttle,

Leave was granted the Committee on Judicial Proceedings, to report a bill entitled, An act to amend section 591, of Article 4 of the Code of Public Local Laws, relating to justices of the peace in Baltimore city.
