Mr. Goldsborough, of Talbot, presented a petition of Samuel T. Hopkins and John Donovan, of Talbot county, for the refunditure of certain taxes;

Which was referred to the Committee on Finance.

Mr. Blackiston, from a select committee,

Reported a bill entitled, An act to increase the number of constables in Kent county;

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Goldsborough, of Talbot, presented the petition of sundry citizens of Easton, Talbot county, in reference to a passenger Railway from Easton to Easton Point and Miles' river, in Talbot county;

Which was referred to Messrs. Goldsborough, Blackiston, and Bradley.

Mr. Watkins offered the memorial of the Maryland State Agricultural Society;

Which was referred to the Committee on Agriculture.

Mr. Blackiston, from a select committee, reported a bill entitled, An act authorizing Jesse K. Hines, Clerk of the Circuit Court for Kent county, to record a deed given to David A. Price by William Whittington and his wife;

Which was read a first time.

On motion of Mr. Watkins,

Leave was granted Messrs. Watkins, Lynch and Smith, to report a bill entitled, An act to make valid the bond of the Clerk of the Circuit Court for Howard county.
