

Q. Did you ever hear of, or see any meeting of the club for the purpose of violence?

A. None, for I would not have countenanced it.

Q. About Mr. Herring's death, do you know anything?

A. I happened to be alongside of the gentleman at the time it occurred. There was a barricade in front of the window, which had been put up by the request of the opposition party; there was a party, who was tight and very unruly, who had got inside of the barricade, and I was working my way for the purpose of getting at that party to take him out; on my way, I got alongside of Mr. Herring, and I discovered that he sank down; I supposed that he had dropped something, and had bowed down to pick it up, but as soon as I got away from him I discovered he had a fit, and when I saw that, I immediately ran and caught hold of him and carried him out. The physician who examined him said that he died from disease of the heart.

By *Mr. Hagner*—Witness. I was born in 1808, and I live in the second ward, and have lived in that neighborhood, perhaps 30 years. My occupation at present is that of Treasurer in the Fell's Point Saving Institution; I was present at the election held in the second ward in November last, I reached the polls between nine and ten o'clock.

Q. What was the condition of the polls, for quiet or the reverse, when you were there?

Q. They were unusually quiet.

Q. Did you see any unusual amount of pushing?

A. No, sir.

Q. Did you see any violence or intimidation offered to voters?

A. Not at the time I was there.

Q. Did you see any persons holding tickets for the Reform party?

A. I saw one or two.

Q. Did you see them molested?

A. I saw parties go up and ask for tickets.

Q. How long did you remain?

A. I was at the polls fifteen or twenty minutes.

Q. Were you at any of the other polls?

A. I was not.

Q. How would the last election compare with others which you have seen in the city of Baltimore?

A. In such elections as that, where there were such a number of important offices to fill, I think, during the time I remained, it was the quietest I have seen for many years.
