but I think the Red Necks took the place of the Staelites. I was connected with the Staelite club, and their object was to drum up in that ward; to meet the primary meetings; to send delegates, and nominate in convention the best men for office. The Red Neck club formed upon the same principle. They are all political clubs, with the exception of the Lazy, and they are a club who meet for the purpose of smoking segars and discussing the current topics of the day, such as Brock's Railway company, and the Three Cent Railway company, &c. The politics of that club are mixed up—some Reformers and some Americans.

Mr. Hagner—Do you know whether there are any Democratic clubs?

A. I do not, sir-not to my knowledge.

All the witnesses present being examined, the committee adjourned to meet at the same place on Tuesday morning.
