Mr. Lynch, from the Committee on Corporations, reported the following bills:

A bill entitled, An act to incorporate the Union Express Company;

Which was read the first time.

A bill entitled, An act to amend the act of 1826, ch. 123, entitled, An act to incorporate the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road Company;

Which was read the first time, and made the order of the day for Tuesday, the 14th inst.

A bill entitled a further supplement to an act entitled, An act to incorporate companies to make several turnpike roads through Baltimore county, and for other purposes, to authorize the laying down and equipment of a Railway on the Baltimore and Yorktown turnpike road, between Baltimore city and Towsontown, and the collection of tolls thereon;

Which was read the first time.

Also, reported favorably on the following bill:

A bill entitled, An act for the relief of James Evans, a constable in and for the first election district of Baltimore county;

Which was read the second time.

Reported with amendment on the following bill:

A bill entitled, An act to add the following sections, relating to banks, to Article 12 of the Code of Public Local Laws;

AMENDMENT:

Ninth line of the second section, strike out all after the word "the," and insert "succeeding Tuesday;"

Which amendment was adopted, and the bill was read the first time.

A bill entitled, An act to alter and amend the 7th section, 8th Article, ch. 88, incorporating Howard Savings Bank of Baltimore;

Was read the second time.

A bill entitled, An act to amend the 97th section of the Code of Public Local Laws, relating to elections in Baltimore county, by directing that elections shall be held at such places as shall or may hereafter be established by law;
