

On motion of Mr. Bradley,

Leave was granted Messrs. Bradley, Grahame and Franklin, to report a bill entitled, An act to pay John T. Wright a sum of money, for services rendered as Assistant Doorkeeper to the Senate, under an order of the Senate at January session, 1858, page 608.

Mr. Goldsborough, of Talbot,

Presented a memorial numerously signed by citizens of Baltimore, praying the removal of Judge Stump, of the Criminal Court, and movcd its reference to a special committee;

Which was read.

Mr. Yellott offered, as a substitute, that it be referred to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings;

Which was determined in the negative.

The question then recurred on the motion to refer it to a special committee;

And it was carried.

The President appointed Messrs. Goldsborough, of Talbot, McKaig and Yellott.

Mr. Goldsborough, of Talbot, from the Committee on Finance, reported a bill entitled, An act to authorize the Comptroller to state and adjust the claims of David C. Blackiston, Administrator of William H. Blackiston, deceased, for over payment made to Edward A. Moore, deceased, former State's Attorney for Kent county, on State Tax of 1845, after the application of the estate of the said Edward A. Moore to the payment of his debts, and to draw a warrant upon the Treasurer for whatever may be found due the said Administrator;

Which was read the first time.

Mr. McKaig, from a select committee, reported a bill entitled, An act to make valid the qualification of Levi Rice, one of the commissioners elected at the late election in Allegany county;

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Goldsborough, of Talbot, from the Committee on Finance, reported a bill entitled, An act to authorize and require the State Treasurer of Maryland to pay to David C. Blackiston, Administrator of William H. Blackiston, late of Kent county, deceased, the sum of money levied and overpaid to the Treasurer by said Administrator;

Which was read the first time.
