A bill entitled, An act to provide for the publication of the Public Local Laws in the counties and city of Baltimore ;

Which was read the first time.

A bill entitled, An act to continue in force the act to incorporate the Kent county Rail Road Company, passed January session, 1856 ;

Was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

A bill entitled, An act to authorize the Circuit Courts of this State, and the Superior Court of Baltimore city, to decree a sale by femes covert of their property, in certain cases therein specified ;

A bill entitled, An act to amend the 99th section of the 42d Article of the Code of Public General Laws, which provides for ordering out the militia in case of insurrection or threatened invasion, insurrection or opposition to the laws, so as to exempt the city of Baltimore from the provisions of said section ;

Was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

A bill entitled, An act to change the name of Jacob David McCue, of Carroll county, to Jacob David Hoppe ;

Was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

A bill entitled, An act to add the following section to Article 14th of the Code of Public Local Laws for Kent county, relating to roads ;

Was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

A bill entitled, An act to amend the 28th Article of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to county commissioners, by adding thereto the following section giving power to the county commissioners to reduce assessments ;

Was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
