On motion of Mr. Townsend,

A bill entitled, An act to add a new section to the Code of Public Local Laws, for the inspection of lumber in this State, Was taken up.

Mr. Townsend offered the following

AMENDMENTS :

In the fourth line, after the word Baltimore, strike out "one," and insert "twenty."

In the fifth line, after the word Perryville, add "one for Heckart Town and one for North East."

Which were adopted.

Mr. Heckart moved to strike out the 16th section.

Which was adopted.

Mr. Townsend offered the following

AMENDMENT :

Section 18. That each inspector before he shall proceed to act under the provisions of this law, shall pay into the Treasury the sum of one hundred dollars.

Mr. Heckart offered the following amendment to the

AMENDMENT :

"This sum to apply to the city of Baltimore, and twenty dollars to be paid by each of those for the several counties."

Which was adopted.

The bill was then read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Mr. Yellott submitted the following resolution :
