A bill entitled, An act to repeal sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19 and 20 of Article 19 of the Public General Laws;

A bill entitled, An act to amend the the 7th section of Article 93 of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to the appointment by the Treasurer of clerks, to assist in the discharge of his duties;

A bill entitled, An act to refund to Mrs. Mary Tabler certain moneys erroneously paid ;
