On motion of Mr. McKaig,

Leave was granted the Committee on Finance to introduce a bill entitled, An act to refund to Elizabeth A. Watson forty-three dollars and sixty-four cents, being the amount overpaid the State by her for State taxes.

On motion of Mr. McKaig,

Leave was granted the Committee on Finance to introduce a bill entitled, An act to authorize the County Commissioners of Allegany county to levy, for the use of Elizabeth A. Watson, as the heir of John Davis, deceased, taxes overpaid.

On motion of Mr. Stone,

Leave was granted Messrs. Stone, Dashiell and Kimmel, to introduce a bill, regulating the sale and manufacture of Gas in the city of Baltimore, for illuminating purposes, and to grant to such persons and corporations, as may hereafter be organized, certain powers and privileges.

On motion of Mr. Kimmel,

Leave was granted the Committee on Finance to report a bill entitled, An act appropriating a sum of money to pay for the frame to the painting illustrating the surrender, by General Washington, of his commission as Commander in Chief of the Army of the American Revolution.

Mr. Gardiner offered the following order:

Ordered, That the Committee on Finance be instructed to enquire into the expediency of repealing the act passed at December session, eighteen hundred and forty-four, chapter two hundred and thirty-seven, entitled, An act imposing a tax on Collateral Inheritances, Distributive Shares and Legacies; also, tax on Administrators and Trustees;

Which was adopted.
