Also, a bill entitled, An act to authorize Edward Long to settle his account as guardian to John C. Barkley, and deliver over the estate to his said ward;

Which was read, and referred to the Committe on the Judiciary.

On motion Mr. Dashiell,

Leave was granted Messrs. Dashiell, Kimmel and Stone, to introduce a bill entitled, An act to change the name of Shalmanezer Newman to Sidney Charles Newman.

The Clerk of the House delivered the following resolution:

Endorsed, "passed by yeas and nays."

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Adjutant General be and he is hereby requested to furnish Capt. McCoy, of the Rohrersville Union Guards, fifty Minie muskets, with the necessary accourtements, from the quota due the State from the General Government for the year 1859, upon his giving security for their safe keeping and return when required by the State.

Which was read and referred to the Committee on Militia.
