

Said bill was then returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Yellott, from the Committee on Invalid Deeds and Defective Proceedings, reported the following bill :

A bill entitled, An act to amend the 29th Article of the Code of Public General Laws, by amending the 56th section thereof, so as to provide for the removal of equity causes from the Superior Court of Baltimore city to the Circuit Court for Baltimore city;

Which was read the first time.

Also, favorably on the following bill :

A bill entitled, An act to amend the 24th Article of the Code of Public General Laws, by amending the 19th section, relating to the recording of deeds, and by adding to said Article a new section, to make valid acknowledgments made before Commissioners;

Which was read the second time.

On motion of Mr. Yellott,
