

A bill entitled, An act to grant the leave of the Legislature to the Vestry of Zion Parish, in Prince George's county, to dispose of their interest in the Bladensburg Episcopal parsonage and lot, in said county;

Which was read the first time, and referred to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings.

A bill entitled, An act to incorporate Curtis' Creek Bridge Company;

Which was referred to the Committee on Corporations.

A bill entitled, An act to amend Article 10 of the Code of Public Local Laws, relating to the incorporation of the town of East New Market, by substituting sundry sections, in lieu of sections 134, 137, 141, 142, and 146;

Which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Goldsborough, of Dorchester, Nuttle and Heckart.

A bill entitled, An act to incorporate the Baltimore and Little Gunpowder Fall's Turnpike Company;

Which was read the first time, and referred to the Committee on Corporations.

A bill entitled, An act to regulate the per diem of the jurors and bailiffs of the Circuit Court for Baltimore county, and to repeal and alter sections 118 and 95 of Article 3d of the Code of Public Local Laws;

Which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Lynch, Stone and Blackiston.

A bill entitled, An act to authorize the school commissioners of Charles county to pay over to the executors of George R. Fulmer, the amount of money ascertained to be due for services as teacher;

A bill entitled, An act to authorize Samuel Swan to settle his accounts as Guardian to John Hancock, and deliver over the estate to his said ward;
