In section 3, strike out all after the word "than" in the fourteenth line to the word "twelve" in the fifteenth line.

In section 3, line nineteen, strike out all after the word "referees" to the end of the section.

Strike out all of section five, and insert :

*And be it enacted,* That all persons selling grain, shall give to the Inspector General an accurate account, in writing, of all grain sold by them, designating the kinds, quantity, price and purchaser's name, under a penalty of twenty dollars for each omission, to be recovered before a justice of the peace, in the city of Baltimore, as small debts are now recovered, and in the name of the Inspector General; which said reports, or an abstract or table, to be made therefrom, shall be recorded in the book of the said Inspector General, subject to the inspection of the owner, or his authorized agent; and said fines shall be paid into the Treasury of the State.

Strike out all of section seven and insert as follow :

Section 7. *And be it enacted,* That each of said Inspectors shall make a daily return, as far as practicable, to the In-
