An act appropriating a sum of money in payment for legal services rendered by Daniel M. Henry, at the request of the Governor of this State.

A bill entitled, An act to authorize and require the Treasurer of Maryland to pay David C. Blackiston, administrator of Wm. H. Blackiston, late of Kent county, deceased, a sum of money, being an overpayment into the Treasury by said administrator.

Which were severally endorsed, "passed by yeas and nays."

Mr. Miles, from a select committee, reported favorably on the following bill:

A bill entitled, An act to amend the 12th, 14th, 15th and 16th sections of the 41st Article of the Code of Public General Laws, so as to change the time of fishing in the Potomac river, to prohibit persons from fishing with seines or gill-nets opposite the shores of the owner or occupier of any fishery, to provide for a proper enforcement of the provisions of the said sections, and to define the rights of bona fide citizens of the counties bordering on the said river;
