## TUESDAY, January 17th, 1860.

Mr. Goldsborough, of Talbot, presented the petition of sundry citizens of Talbot county, asking for the construction of a bridge over the Choptank river;

Which was referred to a select committee, consisting of Messrs. Goldsborough, of Talbot, Nuttle and Townsend.

Mr. McKaig, from the Committee on the Judiciary, reported a bill entitled, An act authorizing the Register of Wills, of Baltimore county, to allow the original will of James D. Wolf to be withdrawn from his office;

Which was read the second time.

Mr. Goldsborough, of Talbot, from the Committee on the Judiciary, reported a bill entitled, An act to change the name of Lucretia Smithson, of Baltimore county, to Lucretia Bosly.

Which was read.

Mr. Gardiner, from a select committee, reported a bill entitled, An act to amend the eighty-third section of the seventy-fourth Article of the Code of General Laws, so as to extend the right to sue Captains and owners of vessels and steamboats in the county where they take in freight;

Which was read the first time.

The Clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following bill:

An act entitled, An act to change the name of Daniel Orick Bosly to Daniel Orick Bosly, junior;

Which was read the first time, and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary.

On motion of Mr. McKaig,

The report on the boundary line was taken up, and referred to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings.

The resolutions instructing the Senators and Members of Congress from Maryland, in relation to the Speakership of the House of Representatives,

Was read the second time.
