A bill entitled, An act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from the west end of Uniontown, in Carroll county, to the completed terminus of the Westminster and and Hagerstown Turnpike road ;

Which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Smith, Kimmel and Heckart.

A bill entitled, An act to establish a uniform system of public schools in Allegany county, and to repeal the 147th, 148th, 149th, 150th, 151st, 152d, 153d, 154th, 155th, 156th, 157th, 158th, 159th, 160th, 161st, 162d, 163d, 164th, 165th, 166th, 167th, 168th and 169th sections, of Article 1 of the Code of Public Local Laws, relating to Allegany county ;

Which was read the first time, and referred to the Committee on Education.

A bill entitled, An act to provide for the transmission to the Circuit Court of Washington county of certified copies of papers and proceedings in the case of *Gilmer vs. Brien*, removed from High Court of Chancery to the Superior Court of Baltimore city ;

A bill entitled, An act to allow George W. Chiswell, late collector of taxes in the third election district of Montgomery county, further time to complete his collections ;
