

A bill entitled, An act to make public a road leading from the village of Catonsville, in Baltimore county, to the Rolling road, comprising the whole of the road known as Blormbury lane, and the road now leading from the end of such lane to the said Rolling road ;

Which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Lynch, Watkins and Yellott.

A bill entitled, An act authorizing the commissioners of Baltimore county to refund to Thomas E. Gittings county taxes erroneously paid ;

Which was read the first time, and referred to the Committee on Finance.

On motion of Mr. Duvall,

The roll of the Senate was called, and the following Senators answered to their names :

A bill entitled, An act for the benefit of the Easton Gas Light Company of Talbot county.
