A bill entitled, An act to repeal the 21st and 26th sections of the 55th Article of the Code of Public General Laws, regulating the issuing of licenses to hawkers and pedlars, and to substitute therefor the following section, regulating and restraining the issue of such licenses;

A bill entitled, An act to amend the 7th section of Article 33 of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to the indigent blind, and to make additional provisions for their instruction;

Which was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
