Ordered, That so much of the Governor's Message as relates to the commission to procure certain documents, relating to the history of the State, the condition of the State records and archives, and the necessity and propriety of their future preservation and publication, be referred to a special committee;

Mr. Heckart submitted the following order:

Ordered, That a select committee of five be appointed to inquire into the system, regulations, and affairs generally, of the Chesapeake and Delaware Canal, so far as such inquiries be consistent with the charter of said company, and that the committee have power to send for persons and papers;
