

Mr. Goldsborough, of Talbot, from the Committee on Finance, reported favorably on the following bills:

A bill entitled, An act to refund to Thomas E. Gittings, of Baltimore county, State taxes erroneously paid ;

A bill entitled, An act authorizing the commissioners of Baltimore county to refund to Thomas E. Gittings county taxes erroneously paid ;

A bill entitled, An act appropriating a sum of money for the payment of the claims of W. Viers Bowie, for legal services rendered the State ;

A bill entitled, An act to amend the 72d section of Article 3 of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to the fees of officers ;

A bill entitled, An act to authorize the Treasurer of the State, upon the warrant of the Comptroller, to pay a sum of money to John D. Ehlus, a private in the Baltimore City Guards, who was seriously injured during the riots on the main stem of the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road, in the month of May, 1857, and appropriating the sum of two hundred dollars in full payment therefor ;

A bill entitled, An act to refund to B. F. Anderson, executor of Wm. Anderson, deceased, money erroneously paid by him into the Treasury of the State ;

A bill entitled, An act to authorize the Comptroller to adjust and settle the accounts of the Inspectors of Grain in the city of Baltimore ;

A bill entitled, An act to amend the 57th section of the 8th Article of the Code of Public Local Laws, which fixes the pay of the Clerk of the County Commissioners, of Cecil county, by substituting for said section the following, increasing the pay of said clerk ;

A bill entitled, An act to refund to Henry T. Scott, administrator of William Scott, late collector of State and county taxes for Prince George's county, certain moneys overpaid by said administrator into the Treasury of Maryland ;

A bill entitled, An act to amend the Code of Public General Laws, Article 95, relating to weights and measures, by repealing the 18th section of said Article, and substituting the following in lieu thereof ;

A bill entitled, An act appropriating a sum of money for the payment of the claims of Joseph C. White, Sylvester Mudd, Samuel Hindes, George Jacobs, George E. Franklin, H. G. Letourneau, John Lindenborn, James Wilson, Thomas
