

A bill entitled, An act to amend the 99th section of the 42d Article of the Code of Public General Laws, which provides for ordering out the militia in case of insurrection or threatened invasion, insurrection or opposition to the laws, so as to exempt the city of Baltimore from the provisions of said section;

Mr. Goldsborough, of Talbot, presented the petition of merchants and consumers of fish in Prince George's county, praying the passage of the bill relating to the inspection of fish in the city of Baltimore;

Mr. Goldsborough, of Talbot, presented the petition of J. B. Brinkley & Co., Thomas Deford, and sundry other merchants of Baltimore, against the passage of the law for the inspection of fish in said city;

Which was read, and referred to the Committee on Finance.

A bill entitled, An act to authorize the Appeal Tax Court of Baltimore city to hear the appeal of Eliza McFadden;

Was read the third time, and passed by yeas and nays as follow:
