

A bill entitled, An act to incorporate St. Vincent's Infant Asylum, in the city of Baltimore;

A bill entitled, An act to incorporate a company to build a turnpike road from the Georgetown turnpike to the public road leading from Adamstown to Greenfield Mills;

A bill entitled, An act to incorporate the Merchants' Hotel Company of Baltimore city;

Which were severally read the second time.

The Clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following bill:

A bill entitled, An act to add an Article to the Code of Public General Laws of this State, under the title of Riparian Proprietors, and declaratory of their rights bounding on the navigable waters of this State;

Which was read the first time, and referred to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings.

The Clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the Report of the Special Committee appointed to examine the charges preferred against Judge Stump;

Endorsed, "Passed by yeas and nays."

Mr. Yellott submitted the following message:

*By the Senate,*

March 7th, 1860.

*To the House of Delegates:*

The Senate informs your Honorable Body, in reply to the message this day received from you, in regard to the case of Judge Stump, that the Senate has passed the resolutions hereto annexed, and that it is therefore impossible to concur in the action proposed by you, until the trial of Judge Stump, as contemplated by said resolutions, has been concluded.

*Resolved*, That the Senate, having received and considered the Reports made from its Select Committee, to whom was referred the Memorial for the removal of Hon. Henry Stump, Judge of the Criminal Court of Baltimore city, hereby fixes Thursday, the 8th day of March, 1860, for the trial of the said Henry Stump, as Judge of the Criminal Court of Baltimore city, upon the charges made against him by the said Memorial.

*Resolved*, That the said trial shall commence at 11 o'clock, A. M., on said day, and shall be proceeded with in preference to all other business; and the Secretary of the Senate is here-
