A bill entitled, An act to amend the 82d Article of the Code of Public General Laws, by exempting a certain amount of property from execution;

A bill entitled, An act to repeal sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19 and 20 of Article 19 of the Public General Laws,
